About WVTC

We are a unique Vocational Training Centre that opened as a Free School in 2015. As part of the Central Learning Partnership Trust we moved in to our new purpose built facilities, based in Ettingshall, in September 2017. Our Centre offers vocational training and work related opportunities to young people between the ages of 16-19 with an EHCP.

Our main focus is to prepare our students for an independent and positive future following their interests and aspirations. Our curriculum reflects this and they are able to select opportunities from a range of vocational and academic courses which include:

We offer a range of nationally recognised qualifications for the courses listed including B-TEC, City & Guilds, OCN and others. All students are expected to continue studying English & Maths as well as Personal Development and Employability qualifications throughout their time here.

Whilst at the Centre students will attend for a minimum of **16** hours with the majority of that time following a personalised timetable reflecting their individual vocational pathways and work experience opportunities.

A vital part of the student's time at the Centre will be quality work experience placements. Students may undertake a range of different placements whilst at WVTC that could range from independent positions to small group assignments.

These opportunities could include vocational subject projects, community projects, working within a different department at the centre, linked CLPT schools or EBP WEX organisations. We aim for these placements to be closely related to the students vocational pathways however this can't always be guaranteed.

Our aim is that by the time our students leave WVTC they will be fully equipped with the skills to function successfully in a work environment or to continue to develop their skills through further education or training courses and contribute fully to society in a meaningful and positive manner.
